<p>What exactly do we clean?</p>	<p>The scope of Digital Cleanup Day can be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Data stored in the your computer and cloud (e.g. pix, videos, etc.) <input type="checkbox"/> Emails and attachments <input type="checkbox"/> Data, photos and videos stored in your phone <input type="checkbox"/> Your social network accounts
<p>Who should get involved?</p>	<p>Engage your:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Family <input type="checkbox"/> Friends <input type="checkbox"/> Social networks <input type="checkbox"/> Neighbors <input type="checkbox"/> Colleagues
<p>Where can it be organized?</p>	<p>Suitable sites include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> At home <input type="checkbox"/> All together as a family in front of the devices <input type="checkbox"/> Remotely by video conference

When are the actions to be taken?	Measure the impact and submit the results on the digitalcleanupday.org webpage by or on 16 March .
How much data is cleaned?	Measure data volume before and after the operation to know how much you cleaned.
How can this be done in practice?	Use the resources from www.digitalcleanupday.org
